Below is the **WASAD New Convert Follow-up Guide** so that those who get saved have a clear path to discipleship. It is designed to ensure that a new convert isn't just a statistic, but becomes a growing member of the Body of Christ.

THE WASAD NEW CONVERT 7-DAY FOLLOW-UP GUIDE
Winning a Soul is the Beginning; Making a Disciple is the Mission.

Title: The First 7 Days: Starting Your Journey with Jesus

The Goal: To move a new believer *from* **Decision to Discipleship** through immediate connection and basic biblical grounding.

🔴 **Step 0: The "Golden Hour" (Immediate Follow-up)**

The first 60 minutes after a confession of faith are critical. Before you leave the new believer:

- * **Exchange Contact Info:** Do not leave without a phone number, email or social media handle.
- * **Give them a 'Sword':** If you have a physical Bible, give it to them. If not, help them download a Bible App with easy to understand versions, not just KJV.
- * **Schedule the First Call:** "I'm going to call you tomorrow just to check in. What time works best?"

📅 **The 7-Day Growth Plan**

This can be sent via daily text messages or covered in two 30-minute meetings.

Day 1: Assurance of Salvation

- * **Scripture:** John 1:12; Romans 10:9,10; 1 John 5:11-12.
- * **The Key:** Salvation isn't based on a feeling; it's based on God's promise. If you have the Son, you have life.
- * **Action:** **Ask them**, "Are you born-again?". Ensure they say yes. **Ask them** how they know and are sure they are born again. **Point them back to the scriptures** in this section. Their assurance of salvation must be based on the word, what God said, not their feeling, thinking or anything else. **Ask them**, "If you were to die tonight, where would you go?" **Ensure** they answer "Heaven" based on Jesus' work, not their own.

Day 2: Talking to Your Father (Prayer)

- * **Scripture:** Exodus 33:11; Jeremiah 29:12; 33:3; Philippians 4:6; Matthew 6:7-13.
- * **The Key:** Prayer is 'Conversation with God'. You talk to God like a friend and you listen to hear what God says. You may want to write down your conversations with God.
- * **Action:** Encourage them to pray for 2 minutes today or as long as they want to - thanking God for saving them and to see what God says back to them. Demonstrate prayer and guide them to pray if meeting in person or over the phone/Zoom.

Day 3: Feeding Your Soul (The Word)

- * **Scripture:** John 1; Psalm 119:105; 1 Peter 2:2.
- * **The Key:** The Bible is spiritual food.
- * **Action:** **Ask them** to read John Chapter 1. **Ask them** to text or email you one thing they learned about Jesus. **Guide them** into establishing a daily Bible reading system that works for them. Remember that the key is **consistency**, not rushing to read the whole Bible.

Day 4: The Clean Slate (Repentance & Grace)

- * **Scripture:** Proverbs 28:13; 1 John 1:8-10; Romans 8:1.
- * **The Key:** When we mess up, we don't run from God; we run to Him.

* **Action:** **Explain** that "Repentance" means a change of mind and direction. **The Holy Spirit convicts us** to run to God in repentance. **The devil condemns us** to run away from God in shame and separation from God which leads to spiritual death. **Compare** Peter and Judas in this regard.

Day 5: Finding Your Family (The Church)

* **Scripture:** Ecclesiastes 4:9-12; 1 Corinthians 12:12-27; Hebrews 10:25.

* **The Key:** A coal out of the fire goes cold. We need other believers.

* **Action:** **Invite** them to your church service or small group this week. **Offer** to pick them up or make transport arrangements easy for them. If they are in a different location from you, **remind** them a day before and on the day. **Check in** after to find out how it went. **Ask** what stood out for them.

Day 6: The Public Declaration (Baptism)

* **Scripture:** Matthew 28:9; Acts 2:41; 8:12, 35-38.

* **The Key:** Baptism is an outward sign of an inward change. It's "going public" with your faith.

* **Action:** **Explain** what baptism is and **ask** if they are ready to be baptized. **Arrange** their Baptism immediately. All that is required for baptism is salvation. The Bible describes baptism as **complete water immersion**, representing a spiritual cleansing and new life in Christ. **Jesus' Example:** Jesus was baptized by John the Baptist in the Jordan River setting an example for believers.

Day 7: Joining the Mission (WASAD)

* **Scripture:** Mark 16:15; Matthew 28:18-20; Acts 9:1-19a; 22:1-21; 26:9-23.

* **The Key:** You are saved to serve! You now have a story to tell.

* **Action:** Ask them, "Who is one person you know who needs to hear what happened to you this week?" Help them share their testimony with that person.

The "Hand-Off" Table

As the **WASAD** soul-winner, you are the "midwife," but the local church is the "nursery."

 **Pro-Tip for WASAD Leaders:**

Create a "**New Convert Starter Pack**" (digital or physical). It should contain:

- * A copy of the Gospel of John.
- * A "**Welcome Home**" card with your contact info.
- * A simple list of 5 local Bible-believing churches in your city.
- * If a convert is in another location, do not end the conversation without finding a local Bible-believing church or ministry near them.


Never Walk Alone
